DEFINITIONS:

<u>Written Briefing</u>: Items that generally do not require a presentation or discussion by the staff or Council. On these items the staff is seeking direction from the Council or providing information in a written format.

<u>Verbal Briefing</u>: These items do not require written background information or are an update on items previously discussed by the Council.

<u>Regular Item</u>: These items generally require discussion between the Council and staff, boards, commissions, or consultants. These items are often accompanied by a formal presentation followed by discussion.

NOTICE: The City Council may recess from the open session and convene in a closed executive session if the discussion of any of the listed agenda items concerns one or more of the following matters:

- (1) Pending/contemplated litigation, settlement offer(s), and matters concerning privileged and unprivileged client information deemed confidential by Rule 1.05 of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct. Sec. 551.071, Tex. Gov't Code.
- (2) The purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property, if the deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the position of the City in negotiations with a third person. Sec. 551.072, TEX. GOV'T CODE.

 - bidding and pricing information for purchased power, generation and fuel, and Electric Reliability Council of Texas bids, prices, offers, and related services and strategies;
 - effective fuel and purchased power agreements and fuel transportation arrangements and contracts;
 - risk management information, contracts, and strategies, including fuel hedging and storage:
 - plans, studies, proposals, and analyses for system improvements, additions, or sales, other than transmission and distribution system improvements inside the service area for which the public power utility is the sole certificated retail provider; and
 - customer billing, contract, and usage information, electric power pricing information, system load characteristics, and electric power marketing analyses and strategies. Sec. 551.086; Tex. Gov't Code; Sec. 552.133, Tex. Gov't Code]

KIMLEY-HORN CONTRACT AMOUNT APPROVAL FOR EASTERN HILLS COUNTRY CLUB REDEVELOPMENT STUDY

ISSUE

Consideration of an amendment to the Eastern Hills Redevelopment study consulting contract which requires that the agreement be approved by the City Council

COUNCIL GOAL

Sustainable Quality Development and Redevelopment

BACKGROUND

In 2015 the City engaged Kimley-Horn as a consultant team to evaluate potential uses for the vacant Eastern Hills Country Club property and to facilitate discussions between the property owner, potential developer and the neighboring property owners. This contract was approved with a total cost of \$98,395. An Advisory Committee comprised of representatives of each of the stakeholders was formed to work with the consultant team and City staff. After several meetings of the Advisory group and a report to the City Council, at the August 17, 2015 Work Session the Council directed staff and the consultant team to undertake an additional attempt towards a compromise between the representatives of the neighborhood and the representatives of the owner and potential developer. The consultant team was also asked to provide additional research regarding other properties across the nation on which abandoned golf courses had been redeveloped. Consequently, the scope of services was modified and exceeded the previously agreed-upon scope which resulted in an additional invoice of \$4,750, bringing the total contract to \$103,145.

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. The revised scope of services included additional meetings with the Advisory Committee members, both individually and as a group, as well as research into other golf course redevelopment scenarios across the U.S. The consultant team then reported back to the City Council during the November 2, 2015 work session.
- 2. Because the contract amount exceeds \$100,000 City Council approval is required.

BIOTEL INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT

ISSUE:

COUNCIL GOAL:

Consistent Delivery of Reliable City Services

BACKGROUND:

The 2015-2017 BioTel Interlocal Agreement was received in the middle of December 2015. The City of Garland's total portion of the fee for the performance of the services provided by the BioTel system for the years 2015 - 2017. This fee will be paid in two payments, \$ 92,486.00 for year 2015–2016 and \$ 94,217.00 for year 2016-2017.

Costs are shared among twelve agencies in the BioTel system. The cost allocated to the BioTel System members are on a per capita basis. The cost per capita used in this

contract is \$ 0.4055353 for year 2015-2016 and \$ 0.4131217 for year 2016-2017. The City of Garland's population estimate is 228,060. The population estimates used in this contract are from the North Texas Council of Government's Annual Census Estimates from March 2012.

CONSIDERATION:

The City of Garland uses BioTel services to provide medical control for emergency medical services. The current core functions of BioTel are:

- 24/7/365 availability of "one stop shopping" for EMS problem resolution for EMS agency personnel by highly trained and experienced BioTel RN's and paramedics.
- 2. 24/7/365 availability of on-line clinical consultation for paramedics and EMS supervisors by highly trained and experienced BioTel RN's, paramedics, emergency physicians and EMS faculty.
- 3. Assistance with specialty hospital destination decision-making.
- 4. Hospital notification of routine and critical patient transports.
- 5. Assistance with determining the appropriate destination when area hospitals report high volume and clinical advisories related to overcrowding and/or resource availability.
- 6. MCI transport coordination including patient distribution, hospital polling for resources, hospital notification and communication with critical EMS system elements.

BACKGROUND

Housing Tax Credits (HTC), through the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA), promote the development of affordable rental housing for low income households. Texas Government Code 2306.6710 and Texas Administrative Code 11.09(d)(1) requires TDHCA applicants to submit a resolution of support or no objection that has been voted on and adopted by the governing body of the municipality in which the proposed project site is located, in order to satisfy threshold criteria.

The City has received a request asking for Council support for a proposed Tax Credit development project in Garland:

The Palladium USA is considering submitting an application for 9% housing tax credits to TDHCA. Approval would permit an affordable multi-family housing development on a 9 acre site located on the south side of I-30 in close proximity to Northwest Drive. Approximately 160 apartment units are being proposed to be developed on the site.

The applicant will be present at the Work Session to provide a presentation to City Council on their project.

CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. There are three alternatives that Council can consider: a) approve a resolution of support; b) approve a resolution of no objection; and c) take no action
- 2. Because this application is in a competitive situation, support from the City gains points for the applicant in the scoring review from TDHCA. A resolution of no objection gains fewer points for the applicant.
